Department Update

The Department of Family Medicine has hired Paula Brantley, PhD as Director of Research. She will be working with faculty and residents at all of our LSU sites to increase scholarly productivity. The Department has been instrumental in the initiation of a primary care track program which will be offered beginning with next year's medical student admissions class. Primary care track students and rural track students will be assigned together for year one and two small group activities, creating opportunities for primary care-focused sessions. Primary care students will participate in electives conducive to primary care, such as the AHEC summer program, the Family Medicine sponsored new nutrition course, and the interprofessional student care management programs for patients with diabetes (DIME) or the SHINE (School-based Health Interventions in Nutrition and Exercise) program. In addition, students will participate in the previously piloted longitudinal experience throughout their required third year rotations to spend a half day a week in a primary care setting. The department, under the leadership of Drs. Russo and Seeliger, launched a global health elective and the first learners and faculty traveled to Peru to provide services this year. The department, with the assistance of the dean, launched a pilot scribe program for student workers who work in the faculty clinical practices. The department also held a leadership retreat in Baton Rouge with representatives from 4 LSU residency programs as well as the dean's office to strategize ways to improve the clerkship, rural track, and the residency programs.

Medical Students Choosing Family Medicine

The faculty and community preceptors continued to provide a valuable educational experience in family practice for the junior and senior students. The students value their experience with practicing family physicians and the number of students choosing Family Medicine as a career was 20. Of those 20 students, 14 have stayed in Louisiana to train. Here are the students and their training institution:
