(6) The Foundation will participate in the **2026 AAFP FUTURE Conference**. This year's conference will be held in Kansas City. The LAFP staff coordinated our recruitment presence in conjunction with our residency programs. A resident and student delegate were chosen from the LAFP resident and student membership to represent Louisiana during the resident and student congresses, held in conjunction with National Conference. Alternate resident and student delegates were chosen as well.

- (7) In 2025, the Foundation held the prize drawing fundraiser again as part of the plan to meet the year's fundraising goal of \$25,000. It is imperative that the Foundation raises enough funds to continue to support the various state and national programs that contribute to family medicine awareness and involvement as well as the various scholarships for residents and medical students to attend conferences and other educational events. The Foundation **profited \$19,663.10** from this fundraiser.
- (8) At the end of last year and the start of this year, the staff met and put together a robust budget for the Foundation. The goal is to offer as many experiences as the Foundation can for family medicine residents and students by connecting with them, providing an understanding on what LAFP membership is and establishing the connections to colleagues to build that collegial relationship. The total budget that the Foundation will need to raise is about seventy-one thousand dollars. The Partners in Family Medicine Program was put together to raise funds that will target organizations that can support our outreach efforts for our student and resident events. The LAFP Foundation has currently secured \$17,500 in funding from our Partner in Family Medicine program. The 2025-2026 Partners in Family Medicine include Butler McDonald and Ochsner Health will continue as a 2026 Partners.
- (9) The LAFP Foundation also continued the twenty-five for twenty-five campaign, where the LAFP is trying to secure 25 members pledging twenty-five dollars a month to help support primarily sending our resident and student delegates to national conference and annual assembly.
- (10) The Resident Advanced Trauma Life Support Stipend was established to assist our resident members who are interested in taking the ATLS course to help offset the cost associated with the tuition. The LAFP Foundation will reimburse 2 residents per year up to \$500 for successful completion of an accredited Advanced Trauma Life Support course. The reimbursement is based on a first-come, first-served basis.
- (11) Finally, let me thank all of you who have donated to the Foundation this year. It is with these donations that we are able to continue our mission and programs. If you have not donated, allow me to take this time to ask you to strongly consider a gift to the Foundation before the end of the year. Remember no money....no mission....so please give generously!
